Mildred Wilson Obituary

Mildred McGill Wilson, age 97 of Tifton, died Sunday March 25, 2018 at Tift Regional Medical Center.

Funeral services will be held on Wednesday March 28th at 2:00 pm at Mt. Olive Primitive Baptist Church (145 Mount Olive Church Road, Tifton, Georgia). Family will receive friends prior to the service beginning at 1:00 pm at the church.

Mrs. Wilson was born on January 1, 1921 in Tift County to the late John D. and Josie Davis McGill. She graduated from Tifton High and attended ABAC and the University of Georgia. She retired from the Farmers Bank of Tifton (now First Community) and the Georgia Department of Labor.
